Keynote Speaker: Ellen Fineout-Overholt, PhD, RN, FNAP, FAAN, is the Professor of Nursing at the University of Texas at Tyler and author of *Implementing the Evidence-Based Practice (EBP) Competencies in Healthcare: A Practical Guide for Improving Quality, Safety, and Outcomes* and *Evidence-based Practice in Nursing and Healthcare: A Guide to Best Practice*. Dr. Fineout-Overholt is known nationally and internationally as a recognized expert in evidence-based practice. Her work is making a difference in patient and system outcomes all over the world, and has fostered educational research and changes in nursing education in the United States.

- Network with colleagues and engage in interprofessional dialogue around basic, clinical, educational, and translational research studies and findings.
- Explore current research results and/or their application to clinical practice through poster presentations.


